NO MORE OVERFLOW ROLLOFF DUMPSTERS

We are sorry to report that the extra large dumpsters are now gone and probably won't be returning.

The Linn County Landfill where community garbage is taken, now **charges extra money for non-standard items.**

For example: mattresses \$25 each, appliances \$50 each, paint cans \$25 each, and so forth.

This has increased our monthly trash bill by **thousands of dollars**, which unfortunately must be passed along to residents.

Remember

Dumpsters are for **daily household garbage** bagged and tied only.

<u>NO</u> furniture, mattresses box springs, appliances (including televisions), paint, tires, construction debris, or wood.

ANYONE caught, in person or by camera, illegally placing items into community dumpsters will be charged up to \$250.00 for time, travel expense, and landfill fees.

Non-residents putting their trash in Grand View and Summit View dumpsters will be **reported to the City and may face fines.**

We need your help!

See someone putting junk in the dumpster that doesn't belong? Give your community office the date, time, license plate, and ideally a photo. If we catch the perpetrators, you'll get \$25 off your next monthly rent.

Don't Lose Your Home!

This is serious. Someone can get clear title to your home by paying your past-due property taxes and waiting to see if you catch back up.

We had a resident lose their home recently in just this manner.

When you receive a letter saying you taxes are past due or sold at a tax sale, you need to pay close attention to what the letter says and act upon it.

Call the Linn County Treasurer's Office **319-892-5500** for the total past due amounts – you **cannot** see this online at iowataxandtags.org.

If you have a loan on your home and are unable to pay, contact your lienholder. Or, consider a personal loan.

Please **let us know** when you have your tax situation resolved. If you have issues paying, call your community office and we'll see if we can find any way to be of assistance.

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Resident Resources

PREPARE YOUR HOME AND YARD FOR COOLER TEMPERATURES

Outdoor Tasks:

- · Plug in your heat tape.
- Disconnect hoses from outdoor spigots. Drain and store.
- Store outdoor furniture, cushions, toys, etc.
- Rake leaves and shred to use as mulch, or dispose of them with biodegradable bags available at the office.
 Communities pick up yard bags on dry Mondays,
 Wednesdays, and Fridays.
- Walk around your home's exterior and check for loose skirting. Close any that are open. Replace any with holes.
- Central air conditioning unit, covering it may attract mice and they may chew on cord/cables.
- · Clean and store garden tools.
- · DO NOT USE deck, porch, or patio as storage areas.

Indoor Tasks:

- Test smoke and carbon monoxide detectors when you set clocks back Saturday night, November 3.
- Check windows and doors for weather-tightness and install weather stripping where it's needed.
- Change furnace filters in January, April, July and October . Have furnace professionally inspected.
- If needed, set traps for rodents.
- Reverse those ceiling fans again. They should blow upward (clockwise) in winter to push warm air across ceilings and down walls.



Parking, Plowing, Snow Removal

Whether you LOVE winter or HATE it...

Its coming!

During a snow event, Hames managers will plow the streets when 2 inches of snow accumulate.

All cars must be off the street so the plows can go through.

Cars left on streets, Storm Shelters & Office Parking Lots, in vacant home sites, or sites owned by Hames Homes (model homes or not) will be charged a Parking Violation fine.

You may contact your office to make arrangements for guest parking when there is inclement weather is coming.

- When shoveling driveways, please pile the snow either on the lawn in front of your home or behind your driveway. Never shovel the snow back into the street, which creates a driving hazard for your neighbors.
- Please keep in mind that streets may be plowed more than once. We apologize for the inconvenience but we will plow when we believe we can improve the street conditions.
- Residents with fire hydrants: please keep the area around them free from snow for emergency access.

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Requesting Rent , Utility or other Housing Assistance

Waypoint is acting as the centralized intake for rent and utility assistance throughout Linn County.

New applicants in Linn County may contact Waypoint Services at 319-366-7999 and leave a message to assess eligibility for available rent and utility assistance sources.

The Waypoint Housing Services Team has lots of different options. The quickest way to get through the system is go online to the lowa Coordinated Intake Portal (website below), and prefill information. Waypoint's team will call applicants back within 24-hours.

To move even quicker through the system, residents should have copies of bills, income, lot rent, identification, etc. ready.


